SCIENCE/SOCIAL STUDIES

LITERACY THIS WEEK

READER'S WORKSHOP

This week in Reader's Workshop students will learn how knowing the structure of a nonfiction text can help identify important information in the text and enhance their understanding of a topic or subject. Students will also learn how to stop and use "fix-up" strategies when what they are reading does not make sense. Finally, they will learn how to reread the text and use strategies to uncover the meaning of unfamiliar words or phrases.

Writer's Workshop

This week students will continue with the process of publishing their personal narratives. They will continue to type their final drafts and participate in an Author's Circle. During the Author's Circle, students will take turns sitting in the "author's chair" and sharing their narratives with a small group. Students will give and receive peer feedback.

In addition, students will also continue to write a narrative story to accompany their Picasso Frankenstein art.





MATH LESSONS THIS WEEK

EUREKA MODULE 2: LESSONS 15-19

This week, students will add measurements using the standard algorithm to compose larger units once and twice. We will estimate sums by rounding and applying to solve measurement word problems. Lastly, we will decompose once and twice to subtract measurements including three-digit minuends with zeros in the tens and ones place.

MATH TIP ...

A trip to the grocery store is an excellent learning opportunity! As you compare different brands of the same item, ask your child how much you'd save by buying the lower-priced item. You can also tell your child the price of 1 pound of produce and ask them how much it would cost to buy 2, 3, or 4 pounds of that produce.
