# SCIENCE/SOCIAL STUDIES

This week in Science we will begin **Chapter 9: The Water** Cvcle. Students will be introduced to the chapter's key vocabulary, read Lesson 1: "Where Is Water Found on Earth?", and read Lesson 2: "What Is the Water Cycle?". The key vocabulary words that we will work with in this chapter are as follows: fresh water, glacier, groundwater, condensation, evaporation, precipitation, water cycle, atmosphere, oxygen, weather, temperature, and anemometer.

## LITERACY THIS WEEK

### READER'S WORKSHOP

This week in Reader's Workshop, we will continue our Fiction Unit. In Mini-Lesson 3, students will use the shared text "The Claw" by Angela L. Fox to learn how to determine the meaning of literal and non-literal words and phrases to enhance their understanding of fictional texts. In Mini-Lesson 4, students will learn to identify the writer's tone and their own personal response after reading a story, as well as explain how a text's words and illustrations contributed to their mood using the mentor text *Zen Shorts* by Jon J. Muth. In addition, we will practice close reading using the text *Bullfrog at Magnolia Circle* and answer text dependent questions.

#### WRITER'S WORKSHOP

This week in Writer's Workshop we will continue our Schoolwide Opinion Writing Unit: Biography. In Lesson 3, we will use the mentor texts *Mother to Tigers* by George Ella Lyon and *Lou Gehrig: The Luckiest Man* by David A. Adler to discuss each author's purpose and what inspired them to write the biographies they did. In Lesson 4, we will discuss how biography writers highlight important events in their subjects' lives using the mentor texts *Night Flight: Amelia Earhart Crosses the Atlantic* by Robert Burleigh and *If a Bus Could Talk: The Story of Rosa Parks* by Faith Ringgold.

We will also continue to practice constructed responses using the Hopscotch model.





## MATH LESSONS THIS WEEK

EUREKA MODULE 5: LESSON 30, END-OF MODULE REVIEW, AND END-OF MODULE ASSESSMENT EUREKA MODULE 4: LESSON 16

This week, we will finish Module 5: Fractions as Numbers on the Number Line. In Lessons 30, students will partition various wholes precisely into equal parts using a number line method. On Tuesday, we will review for the End-of-Module 5 Assessment, which students will take on Wednesday. On Thursday, we will have a math skills review.

On Friday, we will continue with Module 4: Multiplication and Area. In Lesson 16, students will apply knowledge of area to determine areas of rooms in a given floor plan.
