# SCIENCE/SOCIAL STUDIES

This week we will finish Social Studies Chapter 1: Where in the World is Our Community? We will learn about finding communities within a state and study famous explorers in history.

In addition, we will continue working on our Midwestern States Projects in class.

### LITERACY THIS WEEK

#### READER'S WORKSHOP

This week in Reader's Workshop we will begin our Nonfiction unit of study. We will use mentor texts to recognize three different types of nonfiction text: biography, literary non-fiction, and reference. We will also look at nonfiction text features and use them to sort information in order to find answers to questions that students generate. Lastly, we will discover that reading nonfiction is a slower, more deliberate process than reading fiction.

#### Writer's Workshop

This week we will continue to revise and edit our narrative writing pieces. We will work in partners and use a revision checklist to ensure that our narrative writing pieces are engaging. We will then edit our stories for proper conventions, focusing especially on capitalization. When we are finished, we will type up our narratives and publish them!

In addition, we will also write a narrative story to accompany our Picasso Frankenstein art.

#### EUREKA MODULE 2: MID-MODULE REVIEW, MID-MODULE ASSESSMENT, AND LESSONS 12-14

On Monday, we will review our study guide for the Mid-Module 2 Assessment on Tuesday. In addition, we will round two-digit measurements to the nearest ten on the vertical number line. We will also round two- and three-digit numbers to the nearest ten on the vertical number line. Lastly, we will round to the nearest hundred on the vertical number line.
